Arts Every Day's 2020 10x10 Exhibit is inspired by IDENTITY. This theme is intended to encourage discourse in the classroom about diversity, heritage, and place-based identity using a variety of artistic methods. The 10X10 will provide a platform for students and teachers to share who they are or help give voice to individuals whom they identify with while using art as a tool for exploring those complex ideas and perceptions about oneself.

Requirements:

- Current Baltimore City Public Schools teacher or student
- Create 10in. x 10in. art pieces OR submit a video performance no longer than three (3) minutes (Please note: this is a curated exhibition and we may not be able to accommodate all submissions.)
- Drop off final work and signed artist release forms to Motor House by Dec. 20th by 5pm.

Things to consider:

- 1) What kind of cultural citizen are you?
- 2) Who can be an artist, what is your role as an artist, and how can the arts become a tool for change?
- 3) How do we support young people as they seek to be recognized as citizens?
- 4) Encourage students to explore their characteristics that determine their personal and social identity.
- 5) Students can use art to foster their own artistic and cultural identity and gain a secure sense of cultural self esteem.
